The funeral was held Tuesday at 2 o'clock in St. John's Lutheran church with Rev. Ivar Ramseth officiating. Burial was in St. John's cemetery in Forest township. Mrs. Lepeska was born Dec. 4, 1874, in Forest township, Sophia Margaret, the daughter of Henry and Margaret (Meyers) Siemers. She was baptized and confirmed in Trinity Lutheran church at Faribault and was married December 20, 1892, to Henry C. Fick, who died Oct. 8, 1907. They had lived west of Millersburg. She was married to Joseph Lepeska Sept. 7, 1909. They lived in Forest township before going to Everett, Wash., where they lived three years, then returned to Faribault. They moved to Northfield in October, 1953. Mrs. Lepeska had been a member of St. John's church since 1931.
