Venaro were held at 10:30 a.m. Monday, Nov. 21 from the Cathedral of Our Merciful Saviour with the Very Rev. John MacNaughton officiating. Harold Roach sang "The Strife Is O'er, The Battle Done" accompanied by Mrs. William Schuehle, organist. Interment was in St. John's Union Cemetery in Forest Township. Pallbearers were Arthur Dwyer, Robert Kern, Royal Kern, Roland Kruger, George Luedke and Leonard McDowell all of Faribault. Florence Wharton Venaro was born June 28, 1882 to Albert and Susan Wharton in Forest Township, Rice county. She attended rural schools in this community and did practical nursing and also worked at the Hunter Hospital in Faribault. In 1905 she was united in marriage to Max J. Venaro in Superior, Wis. She was a member of the Cathedral of Our Merciful Saviour, the Guild of the Good Shepherd and the Daughters of Union Veterans. She was a life long resident of Faribault and surrounding area. She passed away at the Rice County District I Hospital Thursday evening Nov. 17 after an extended illness. Prior to her death, she made her home at 618 W. 3rd St. She is survived by her three children, Mrs. A. M. Onsrud (Maxine), Erwin F. Venaro both of Faribault and Merle F. of Sleepy Eye; one sister, Mrs. Gertrude Sand of St. Paul and one brother, Albert A. Wharton of Portland, Ore. also eight grandchildren.
